OSHA Compliance Programs

OSHA compliant written programs as well as employee training are available for the following:

Hazard Communications

Prepares employees to recognize hazardous materials, understand and implement written control procedures and adopt safe work practices

Bloodborne Pathogen

Prepares employees to understand the routes of exposure and the hazards associated with diseases transmitted by blood and body fluids; training includes exposure prevention, personal protective equipment, cleanup and disposal methods and post-exposure medical evaluation and monitoring

Confined Spaces

Prepares employees to understand the requirements of the OSHA standards regarding air sampling, entry permits and protective equipment

Respiratory Protection

Prepares employees to understand the need for respiratory protection; training includes proper type and fit, respirator cleaning and storage and fit testing

OSHA 300 Log

Prepares individual(s) responsible for keeping OSHA records to comply with federal statutes regarding OSHA 300 Log and Employer's First Report of Injury report

Hearing Conservation Program

Includes on-site noise level analysis, audiometric testing and hearing protection education; conducted by CAOHC-certified occupational health professionals

Lockout/Tagout

Prepares employees to work safely around hazardous energy sources to prevent the deadly consequences of unharnessed electrical, hydraulic, pneumatic or mechanical energy; conducted by industrial safety and/or hygiene specialists

OSHA Compliance Programs *(continued)*

Personal Protective Equipment

Written hazard assessment and training prepare employees to safely do their required tasks wearing the appropriate protective equipment

Other customized OSHA compliance programs available include, but are not limited to:

- fall protection
- forklift
- hazardous materials and spill response
- fire extinguisher
